

# Finishing up



Press the back on making sure it is firmly seated against the body of the watch. Swing the watch back into position. You are almost done.



The last step is a little bit tricky. Insert the spring pin through the tab and engage it on one side of the watch tab as shown. I use my fingernail to depress the spring and push it inside the watch tab. Then gently wiggle the pin into the hole in the watch tab.

A word of caution: it is a spring pin. It can come flying out of there never to be seen again.

Also, there is a tool for compressing the spring, called a watch pin removal tool. It has a little V notch at the end to help you compress the spring. It is readily available on Amazon or Harbor Freight. With a little patience, you shouldn't need the tool.
